Alabama admitted to the Union as 22nd State

American Antislavery Society is formed by William Lloyd Garrison and others.

American Temperance Society organized

Antonio Lopez de Santa Anna seizes power in Mexico

Andrew Jackson elected the 7th president of the United States.

Andrew Jackson re-elected President

Anglo-Texans rebel and declare the independence from Mexico

Arkansas admitted to the Union as 25th State

Brigham Young begins moving the Mormon Church to Utah Territory

California admitted to the Union as 31st State

California Gold Rush begins

Charles Grandison Finney feels a call to be a Christian evangelist

Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints is organized by Joseph Smith

Compulsory Public School attendance laws were passed in Massachusetts

Congress declares war on Mexico – Beginning of the Mexican-American War

Congress gives Jackson authority to use troops to enforce Federal Law.

Congress passes legislation that forbids importation of Slaves into the United States

Declaration of Sentiments was published as a result of the Seneca Falls Convention

Doretha Dix begins teaching Sunday School in a Massachusetts Prison

Financial Panic of 1837 begins

First Seminal War is fought in Florida.

Florida admitted to the Union as 27th State

Gadsden Purchase

Gold is discovered in California

Horace Mann becomes a leading advocate of Public School education for all

House of Representatives enacts the first *Gag Rule* (Pinckney Resolutions) which prohibits the discussion of abolition in Congress.

Illinois admitted to the Union as 21st State

Indian removal Act passed by Congress

Indiana admitted to the Union as 19th State

Indians begin relocating from the Southeast to Oklahoma along the Trail of Tears.

Iowa admitted to the Union as 29th State

Jackson vetoes reauthorization of the Second Bank of the United States.

James Polk elected as the 11th president of the United States

John Quincy Adams elected the 6th president of the United States.

Joseph Smith is born in Vermont. He would be the founder of the Mormon Church.

Joseph Smith President of the Mormon Church is killed by a mob

Louisiana admitted to the Union as 18th State

Maine admitted to the Union as 23rd State

Maine becomes the first state to regulate alcohol sale; laws would become known as “Maine Laws.”

Martin Van Buren elected 8th president of the United States.
Michigan admitted to the Union as 26th State
Millard Fillmore becomes the 13th president of the United States when Zachary Taylor dies
Missouri admitted to the Union as 24th State
Nat turner Rebellion begins
Nauvoo, Illinois is settled by the Mormon Church
Northern States begin to pass antislavery laws.
New York Passes the Married Women's Property Act
Ohio admitted to the Union as 17th State
President Polk gets an agreement with Britain over the boundary of Oregon Territory at the 49th parallel.
Sabbatarian Controversy reemerges in United States through the preaching of Lyman Beecher
Second Bank of the United States Chartered
Second Great Awakening begins on the Kentucky Frontier
Second Seminole War begins
Seneca Falls Convention meets in New York and is first convention to address women rights issues.
Spanish forces under Santa Anna attack the Alamo, in Texas.
Tariff of 1828 (Tariff of Abomination) is enacted by congress
Temperance Movement in American begins in Connecticut
Texas is admitted to the Union as the 28th State
Texans defeat the Mexican Army of Santa Anna at the Battle of Jacinto.
The Creek War (The Red Stick War) is in upper Mississippi
Treaty of Fort Laramie
Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo
Unitarian Church founded in New England
Vice President John Tyler becomes the 10th President of the United States when Harrison dies.
Whig Party is formed
William Henry Harrison elected 9th president of the United States.
Wisconsin admitted to the Union as 30th State
Worcester v. Georgia- Supreme Court rules Georgia's seizure of Indian Lands unconstitutional.
Zachary Taylor elected 12th president of the United States
