Marshall Field gains control of department store in Chicago and renames it Marshall Field and Company  
*Melting Pot* a play by Russian immigrant Israel Zangwill opens in Washington DC  
New York City establishes a municipal police department  
New wave of Immigration begins  
New York City has first commercial electric power system  
*Red Badge of Courage* authored by Stephen Crane is published  
Rowland H Macy opens department store in New York City  
Steam Driven Cable cars are put in service in San Francisco, California
