Make Connections

When you learn an unfamiliar word, you may find it helpful to connect the word to events and issues that are familiar to you. Making connections between new vocabulary and your life will help you remember and understand the meanings of words. One good way to make connections is to write a word in a sentence that relates to your life or community. The example below explains the meaning of the word *ally* and uses it in a sentence.

Example

ally person, nation, or group joined with another for a common purpose
